Lenten Sermon Series: Sinning Like a Christian

It seems odd to me to be thinking about Lent, a period of time marked by self-reflection and death, while our church is brimming with signs of life everywhere we turn. Can you believe our 11 a.m. service is doing so well they outgrew their worship space and are now worshiping in the full Great Room? Or what about the fact that over 65 people joined our new small groups this past month, all longing to grow closer to God and one another? And, what a joy it was to celebrate Dustin's ordination and to welcome him as our Associate Pastor for 2018! Yes, there is life all around, and it is easy to get swept up in the joy of it all.

And yet, Lent is coming, a time of year when we are forced to slow down, examine ourselves and remember our own mortality. We hope that you will join us for our Ash Wednesday service on February 14 at 6 p.m. when we kick off our Lenten sermon series "Sinning Like a Christian." Each week during Lent we take a look at one of the seven deadly sins and its accompanying virtue, seeking to understand our own tendency towards sin and discover the better path Jesus came to show us. It is a good way for us to frame our Lenten journey and to prepare us for the ultimate joy of Easter morning!

The Holy Act of Singing Together

On Sunday, February 18 we will be one of many churches across the United States participating in the Center for Congregational Song's *A Capella Sunday*. The Center for Congregational Song is the resource and programmatic arm of The Hymn Society in the United States and Canada. Their mission is to "encourage, promote, and enliven congregational singing."

On A Cappella Sunday, worshiping communities across the United States commit to singing a cappella (without instruments) on the first Sunday of Lent. Marking the beginning of this important season of penitence and preparation by singing without instrumental accompaniments allows us to offer ourselves to God in the most basic

form.

Other purposes and benefits include:

- Connecting to the history of the church. For thousands of years, a cappella singing was the mainstay of the church's song. By recognizing this and exploring this way of music-making, we are acknowledging and honoring the saints of the past. (John Calvin would be proud!)
- Connecting to many Christian denominations, traditions, and regions of the world that
 continue to use a cappella music as their primary mode of music-making in corporate
 worship.
- Offering God a gift different from our usual music-making.

Psalm 96:1 tells us to "Sing a new song to the Lord," which we will do on February 18 by singing a cappella in worship.

Lao Partners Embrace a New Focus

Our December newsletter article was focused on the seven Living Waters for the World (LWW) clean water systems that we, together with our Lao friends, had installed since 2009. We talked about the local political factors that did not permit installing the eighth system in 2017. Our team in Laos planned to have more discussions with the Lao Evangelical Church about future directions as we continued our 17-year partnership.

One might compare a LWW clean water system with a Model 'T' Ford - a car from the WWI days that due to its simplicity, low cost and reliability, quite literally "put America on the road". LWW systems are similarly quite simple, low cost and reliable. But, like motor vehicles, they need to be maintained and repaired.



Our teams have truly enjoyed working directly with the local Lao people to build and test these LWW systems. Each installation is a four-day process, concurrent with training the community on water utilization and hygiene. Our team begins to train the operators to operate and maintain the system during the second day, so that by the fourth day they are training each other on the procedures.

Despite that training, ongoing sanitation and maintenance continues to be a challenge. LWW has encountered similar challenges with the hundreds of systems they have installed in Latin America, and have resorted to hiring and training staff persons in-country to oversee the operation and maintenance of their systems.

While we cannot justify hiring a full time person to oversee these seven LWW systems in Laos, we have shared our concerns with the leaders of the Lao Evangelical Church. We have pointed out to them that in order for such clean water systems to be sustainable, someone in Laos needs to accept responsibility to oversee and monitor the operations, and call for help when problems arise.

Until that occurs, we are shifting our future focus. We will work with LEC on sanitation (hand washing and toilet) facilities, as well as education at elementary schools in rural villages. We will also be supporting LEC's efforts to develop construction-skill apprenticeship programs related to their ongoing church expansion.

We will keep you posted as things develop over the next few months.

Men's Retreat is March 2-4: Sign Up Now


Are you a man? Do you like retreating? Looking for an awesome way to get connected with other guys at UPC?
