
Friendsgiving Potluck | 6 p.m.

A Hymn of Thanksgiving: We Gather Together

A favorite Thanksgiving hymn is We Gather Together. While this text is typically sung as a song of thanksgiving, its origins are significantly different from any Thanksgiving Day associations.

The original context of this late sixteenth-century hymn was actually a celebration of freedom by the Netherlands from Spanish oppression. If we look closely at the verses we can hear the patriotism and political overtones with phrases like, "from the beginning the fight we were winning, thou, Lord wast at our side!" and "The wicked oppressing now cease from distressing." These were all allusions to the persecution of the Catholic Church under the policies of Spain.

Later the hymn gained recognition in the United States when it made its way into the Methodist-Episcopal Church Hymnal in 1935. Its popularity increased during World War II when singers connected "the wicked oppressing" to Nazi Germany.
